

ACCREDITATION

From Interstate 235 from the East

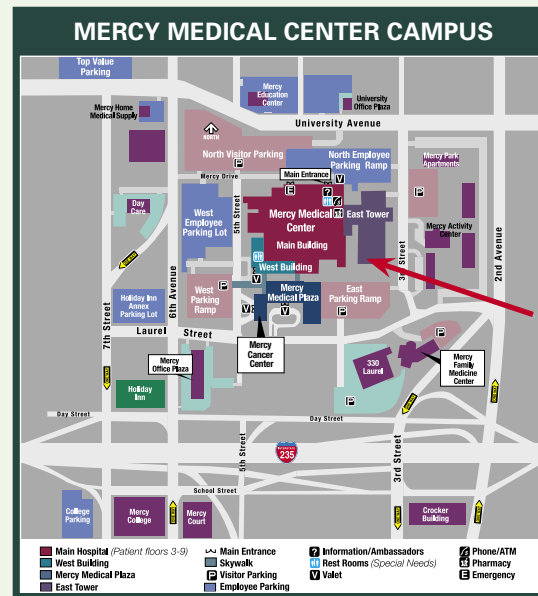

On I-80, take the 2nd Avenue exit and head south to University Avenue. Mercy is approximately four miles south of Interstate 80. Go to University Avenue and turn right. Go four blocks to 6th Avenue and turn left. The main drive entrance to Mercy is one block ahead on your left-hand side.
